

In Tom Bean ISD, these funds are used to invite speakers/programs to the school that present topics related to drug/alcohol use, sexually transmitted diseases, and/or violence. The funds also help buy supplies and materials for Red Ribbon Week as well as provide drug detection services. Character Education supplies are used as well.

Title V, Part A: Innovative Programs

The purpose of this title program is to provide funding to implement promising educational reform programs and school improvement programs based on scientifically based research; to provide a continuing source of innovation and educational improvement, including support programs to provide library services and instructional and medial materials; to meet the educational needs of all students, including at-risk youth; to develop and implement education programs to improve school, student, and teacher performance, including professional development activities and class size reduction programs.

In Tom Bean ISD, these funds are used to purchase library books and credit recovery.

Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP)

This is the term *No Child Left Behind* uses to explain that your child's school has met state reading and math goals. Your school district's report card will let you know whether or not your child's school has made AYP.

Tom Bean ISD did not meet AYP in 2007-2008 as a District, but met AYP on each campus.

Highly Qualified Teachers

This is the term *No Child Left Behind* uses for a teacher who proves that he or she knows the subjects he or she is teaching, has a college degree, and is state-certified. *No Child Left Behind* requires that your child be taught by a Highly Qualified Teacher in core academic subjects.

Tom Bean ISD has achieved the goal of having 98% of their teachers highly qualified for the 2008-2009 school year. This is due to one teacher in an elective class. All core teachers do meet the highly qualified status.

THE NO CHILD LEFT BEHIND PROGRAMS

Title I, Part A: Improving School Achievement

The purpose of this title is to ensure that all children have a fair, equal, and significant opportunity to obtain a high-quality education and reach, at a minimum, proficiency on challenging State academic achievement standards and state academic assessments.

In Tom Bean ISD, these funds are used to purchase materials for the elementary classrooms and to send teachers to professional development workshops. The funds also help pay part of teacher salaries so that all students in the elementary can be served by the program.

Title I, Part C: Education of Migratory Children

The purpose of this title program is to ensure that migrant children also have a fair, equal, and significant opportunity to obtain a high-quality education and reach, at a minimum, proficiency on challenging State academic achievement standards and state academic assessments.

In Tom Bean ISD, these funds are used to join a Shared Services Arrangement with the Education Service Center X in Richardson. The staff of the ESC then contacts and works directly with students and families who qualify as migrant. Services can include items to help students in school as well as health care.

Title II, Part A: Teacher and Principal Training and Recruiting.

The purpose of this title program is to increase student academic achievement through strategies such as improving teacher and principal quality and increasing the number of highly qualified teachers in the classroom and highly qualified principals and assistant principals in schools.

In Tom Bean ISD, these funds are used to ensure that the elementary classrooms have small sizes and that we remain competitive with salaries of our present teachers.

Title II, Part D: Enhancing Education through Technology

The purpose of this title program is to increase student academic achievement through strategies such as the integration of technology into the curriculum areas.

In Tom Bean ISD, these funds are used to join Shared Services Arrangement with the Education Service Center X in Richardson. TBISD may then send teachers to designated professional development so that they are better able to integrate the use of technology into the curriculum of the general classroom. In addition, students will have access to electronic information for research.

Title III, Part A-Limited English Proficiency and Immigrant Students

The purpose of this title program is to provide supplemental resources to help LEP children attain English proficiency in core academic subjects.

In Tom Bean ISD, these funds are used to join a Shared Service Arrangement with the Education Service Center X in Richardson. Services can include items to help students with language barriers.

Title IV, Part A: Safe and Drug-free Schools and Communities

The purpose of this title program is to support programs that prevent violence in and around schools; prevent the illegal use of alcohol, tobacco, and drugs; involve parents and communities; and are coordinated with related Federal, State, school, and community efforts and resources to foster a safe and drug-free learning environment that supports student academic achievement.
